

"DANGLES" STOCKING

Our jester-inspired Christmas stocking will add a fun and festive look to your holiday decorations

SUPPLIES:

- *Coats Dual Duty XP All Purpose Thread*: colors to match all fabrics
- *Red/White checkered fabric*: 4 pieces, 12" x 18" each
- *Fabric scraps*: at least 6" x 15" in several different colors
- *Bias Corded Piping*: 1 package, yellow
- *Extra Wide Double Fold Bias Tape*: 1 package, yellow
- *Baby Rick Rack*: Green
- *Fusible Fleece*: 2 pieces, 12" x 18" each
- *Assorted Buttons*

INSTRUCTIONS:

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ inch.

- 1 Fuse a piece of fleece to the wrong side of two of the red/white checkered pieces of fabric. Trace the stocking shape onto the right side of one of them and cut out. Place the stocking shape against the second fleece piece. Fleece sides together, and cut the stocking shape from the second piece using the first piece as a guide. Place the two remaining pieces of red/white check fabric right sides together. Using the same piece as a guide, cut the stocking shape through both layers of the two un-fleeced pieces of fabric for the lining.
2. Stitch around the entire curved edge of the stocking lining, $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from the edges, leaving the top area open. Do not turn right side out.
3. Baste the piping to the entire curved area of one of the fleeced stocking shapes. Place the second fleeced section over the piped fleeced section, right sides together, and stitch along the curved area again (be sure to leave the top edge open). Clip the curves and turn the stocking right side out.
4. Insert the lining into the stocking. Baste around the top open edge of the stocking to secure the lining in place.
5. Trace 8 of the dangles pattern onto the wrong side of the scraps of fabric. Cut 2 pieces from one of the fabrics and place right sides together. Stitch along the two longer sides of the triangle shape. Cut out the shape $\frac{1}{8}$ inch from the stitching line. Turn right side out and press. Make 8 of these.
6. Arrange the 8 dangles on the upper edge of the stocking, spacing them evenly. Baste in place.
7. Bind the top edge with the bias tape, making a bias tape hanging loop on one side of the stocking.
8. Cut a 22 inch length of rick rack and tie it into a bow. Tack to the stocking near the loop.
9. Stitch one button to the tip of each dangle to complete.
